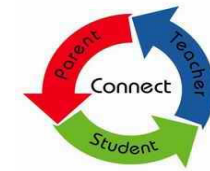
- ⇒ Student centered activities

- ⇒ Frequent two-way communicating with parents about student progress via email, phone, parent portal, progress reports, report cards and conferences.

Students

- ⇒ Be on time, join each class and present for school and class each day in person or on line
- ⇒ Student voice (ask for help when needed) and student choice; communicate with teachers; use email
- ⇒ Collaborative discussion with teachers, individually or in group
- ⇒ Read 30 minutes a day
- ⇒ Use organizational tools (Remind, ISN's, binder, folders, visit the website and each course page; Google Classroom etc.)
- ⇒ Stay on task and complete ALL assignments (during independent practice or in group)

Parents

- ⇒ Check homework folders, syllabus (including the ones in Google Classroom, etc.) and daily agendas. Help the student be organized.
- ⇒ Provide well lit area for homework and time to complete the work
- ⇒ Monitor 30 minutes a day of reading
- ⇒ Frequent visits to parent portal. Email teachers when necessary, phone calls, and attend parent teacher conferences establishing a meaningful two way communication
- ⇒ Sign up for Remind 101 or other apps used by the teachers
